Achieving Fair Justice for the Military

War crimes represent one of the most complex categories of cases we face today. The challenge lies not only in their specifics, the social significance of their consequences, or the number of cases, which is considerable given the scale of this war and is expected to grow further.

The issue is that despite being in the tenth year of the war, we still lack military pre-trial investigation bodies, military prosecutors, and specialized courts.

You have likely heard of the 'million-dollar case'—the story of the inheritance from Hryhorii Stepanets, an American of Ukrainian descent, to our 'Iron General.' However, you may not know that it was our team that provided the legal support behind it.

Let's take a moment to revisit how

Hryhorii Stepanets, an American of Ukrainian descent, bequeathed 1 million US dollars to Valerii Zaluzhnyi and the Armed Forces of Ukraine.

Hryhorii, originally from Ukraine, immigrated to the United States in 1989 and worked as a developer and inventor at Microsoft ever since.

As lawyers, we were mandated to negotiate with the testator's representatives and to successfully organise the transfer of the inheritance for the needs of the Armed Forces of Ukraine — and we with a man admired not only by our entire team succeeded.

This case presented an interesting challenge for us, as we had to navigate the complexities of the inheritance process, taking into account both Ukrainian and US laws, since the will was drafted in the United States while the inheritance occurred in Ukraine. We were able to identify the right effective approaches and carry out the request promptly. We immediately engaged our US-based legal colleagues to provide quick, necessary support and legal advice in the United States.

This case introduced us to a remarkable friendship



but by the nation as a whole.

With the onset of the full-scale invasion, our top priority was to equip the military with essential supplies: personal protective gear, optical devices, drones, first aid kits, and more. This effort led to the establishment of the **#SaveUkraineNow** Coordination Centre, which we co-founded. Our Managing Partner, Andriy Romanchuk, now serves as the Chairman of the Coordination Centre's Supervisory Board.

MORIS SUPPORTS THE ORTHODOX CHURCH OF UKRAINE

We share the view that Ukraine's independence is impossible without a single local Ukrainian church, free from russian influence. That is why, along with many Ukrainians, we were sincerely happy when, in 2018, thanks to the efforts of state authorities, politicians, diplomats, public figures, and representatives of the Ukrainian clergy, Ukraine received the Tomos, granting successful outcome in a long-running dispute at the the right to an independent local Orthodox Church. This was undoubtedly an epoch-making event that brought Ukraine closer to spiritual unity and a final break with russia. Thousands of religious communities in Ukraine have expressed their desire to join the Orthodox Church of Ukraine.

Since 2019, we have been assisting communities in their transition from the Ukrainian Orthodox Church (moscow patriarchate) to the Orthodox Church of Ukraine. We have faced many difficult lawsuits, but nearly 2,000 cases have been resolved in favour of the Orthodox Church of Ukraine. These litigations are often complex would like to describe one such case here.

In April 2024, MORIS attorneys secured a historic victory: for the first time, the Grand Chamber of

the Supreme Court recognised the transition of a community from the Ukrainian Orthodox Church (moscow patriarchate) to the Orthodox Church of Ukraine as legal.

This was the time when MORIS attorneys achieved a Grand Chamber of the Supreme Court.

The dispute began in 2019, when the religious community of the village of Kalynivka (Zhytomyr region) decided to move from the Ukrainian Orthodox Church (moscow patriarchate) to the Orthodox Church of Ukraine, but this decision was challenged in court.

The Grand Chamber of the Supreme Court ruled in favour of the community and confirmed the legality of the transition. This court decision is significant not only for this particular community but also for other religious communities of the Orthodox Church of Ukraine, and can last for years, but it is always important for us as it has set a precedent for protecting their rights in to complete them and achieve a positive outcome. We court cases. Currently, more than 50 such cases are underway, and since 2019, about 1,700 transitions to the Orthodox Church of Ukraine have taken place.
